

Day 220: Jerusalem during “Al-Aqsa Flood” Operation

May 13, 2024



On the 220th day of "Al-Aqsa Flood Operation", settlers set fire to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian Refugees (UNRWA) in the Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood in Jerusalem. The raids on Al-Aqsa and calls to raise flags inside it continued for tomorrow, Tuesday, and the summons and raids continued in Jerusalem.

The Wadi Hilweh Information Center – Jerusalem learned that the settlers threw flammable materials towards the UNRWA headquarters, which led to a fire in part of the square. They also threw stones at the employees and directed insults and obscene words.

The center pointed out that last Thursday, settlers threw flammable materials towards the UNRWA headquarters, which led to a fire in part of the backyard, and was preceded by setting fire to an air conditioner hose installed on the window of the guard room “at the agency’s door,” in addition to the weekly demonstrations in front of the headquarters and an attempt to attack employees and obstructing their access to the agency’s headquarters.

Settlers’ raids into Al-Aqsa Mosque continued during the morning and afternoon incursion periods, and 147 extremists carried out their raids on Al-Aqsa through the Dung Gate.

Calls continued to carry out massive incursions into Al-Aqsa on Tuesday, and to raise Israeli flags inside it.

The raids on towns and neighborhoods in Jerusalem continued, as well as the summoning of young men and boys, in addition to setting up police checkpoints in the city.

In the evening hours, settlers toured the town of Silwan and the Old City, carrying Israeli flags.
