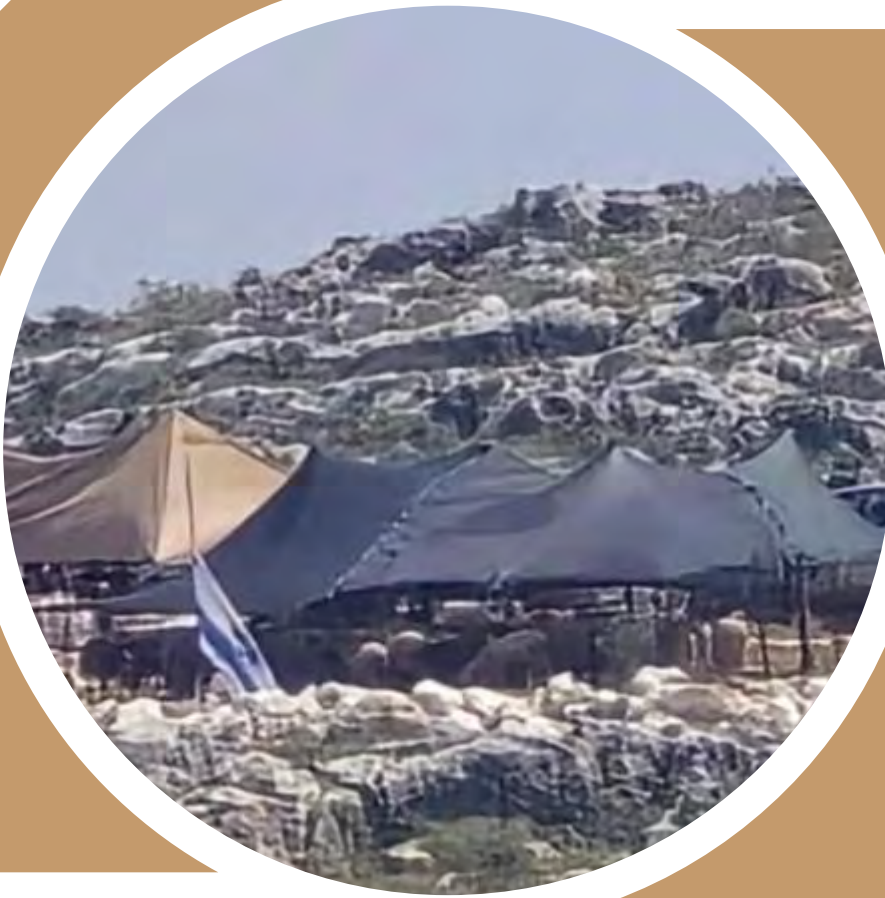

Foreword:

The dangerous, and unprecedented escalation of the occupation state's violations against Palestinian land, which began years ago, and escalated with the formation of the far-right Israeli government, and reached its peak after October 7, aims at eliminating the political process and the possibility of establishing a Palestinian state. What is worth noting is that the Palestinian issue is in dire need of real international solidarity and support, so the international community must elevate its positions and attitudes to the level of the massacres committed against the Palestinians, their lives, lands and properties, given what we are witnessing of the systematic and unprecedented demolition of Palestinian facilities in all places.

These flagrant terrorist attacks by the colonizers demonstrate the extent of the powers granted to them by the official Israeli government, and that the occupation "cabinet" issued its instructions to the colonizers to carry out these attacks.

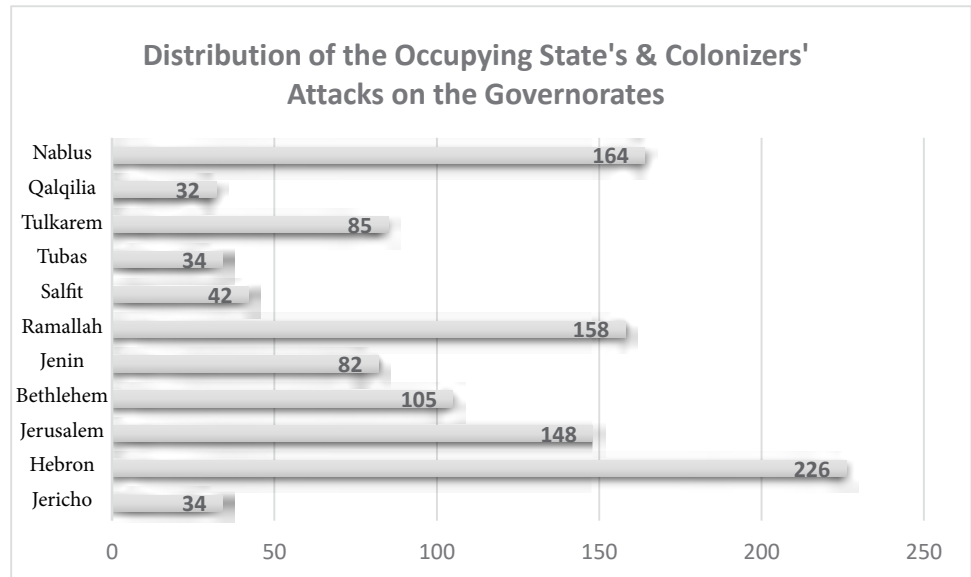

First: Violations of the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers in the Occupied Palestinian Territories during July 2024:

During the reporting period, July 2024, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) monitored 1110 attacks. These attacks were carried out by the various bodies of the occupying state, including its colonial militia, against Palestinian citizens and their properties.

These attacks



included martyrdom, physical injuries, whether by live bullets or gas, as well as incursions, sabotage, theft, and confiscation of property, bulldozing lands, and uprooting trees. However, these attacks were concentrated in the governorate of Hebron which witnessed 226 attacks, followed by Nablus Governorate (164 attacks), then Ramallah Governorate (158 attacks), and finally Jerusalem Governorate which witnessed 148 attacks, in addition to many attacks in the rest of the West Bank governorates. These governorates witnessed intense attacks, about (62%) of the total of the attacks perpetrated in the West bank.

Furthermore, 35 martyrs were recorded during the reporting period in Jerusalem and the West Bank. These attacks included 308 attacks on property and holy places, 71 attacks on lands and natural resources, and 731 attacks on citizens.

Attacks perpetrated by Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers against Palestinian citizens, their properties and holy places.

Attacks on citizens:

During the reporting period, July 2024, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 731 attacks on citizens. Most of these attacks were concentrated in Hebron Governorate which witnessed 128 attacks, followed by Ramallah Governorate which witnessed 114 attacks. Meanwhile, 105 attacks were recorded in each of Nablus and Jerusalem governorates. These attacks included shooting, arrest campaigns, shutting down checkpoints and imposing traffic restrictions on citizens

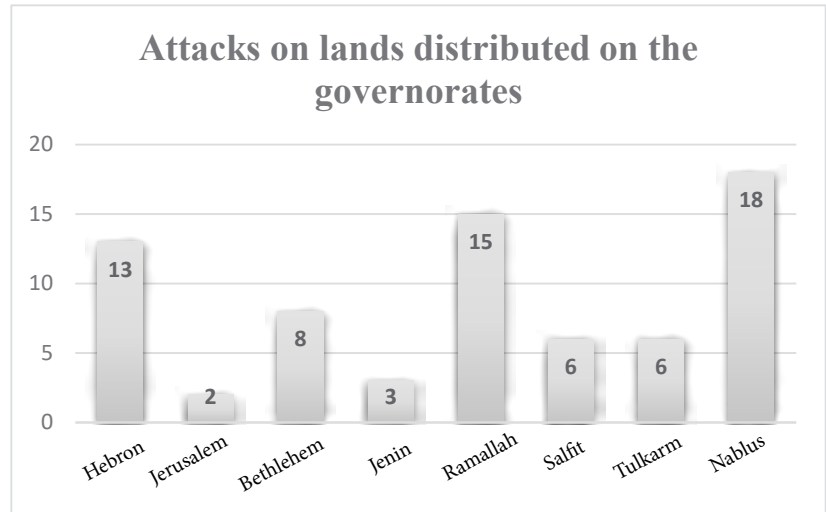

Attacks on Lands & Natural Resources:

During July 2024, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) has documented 71 attacks on the Palestinian lands and natural resources. These attacks were concentrated in Nablus Governorate which witnessed 18 attacks, followed by Ramallah Governorate (15 attacks). Meanwhile, 13 attacks were monitored in Hebron governorate.

These attacks affected hundreds of dunums of citizens' lands. The reporting period, July 2024, witnessed 16 colonial attempts to establish outposts on citizens' lands. In addition, the Israeli occupation forces as well as its colonizers



carried out 15 bulldozing lands' operations. Most of these operations were recorded in Bethlehem Governorate which witnessed 4 operations. Meanwhile, 3 operations recorded in Salfit governorate.¹

Attacks on Trees:

During the reporting period, July 2024, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 39 attacks that targeted olive trees and caused the uprooting, poisoning and burning of 970 trees among which there were 870 olive trees. These attacks were concentrated in Nablus governorate which witnessed 13 attacks and Ramallah govenorate which witnessed 9 attacks.

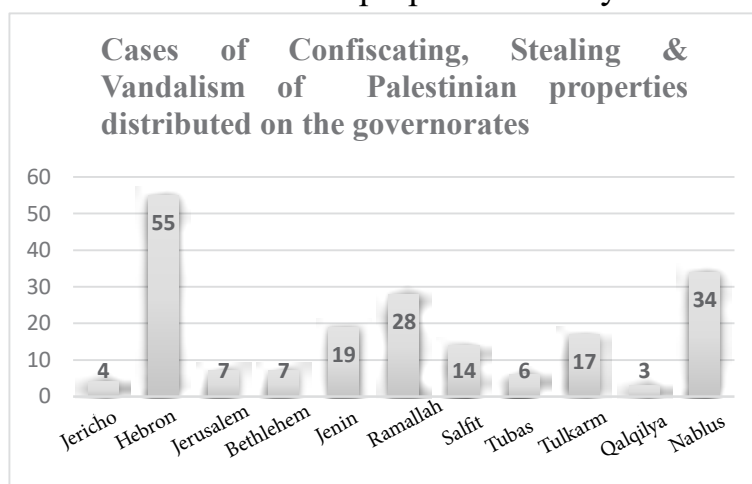

Attacks on Palestinians’ Properties:

During the reporting period, July 2024, the Israeli occupation forces along with the colonial militias carried out 308 attacks on Palestinian properties². They launched

vast campaigns to confiscate, steal, and sabotage citizens’ properties. These properties included agricultural tractors, vehicles, bulldozers, motorcycles, electric vehicles, camera recordings, and theft of money, cows and agricultural



fertilizers. These campaigns caused the confiscation, sabotage and stealing of about 194 properties; among which, the Israeli forces confiscated 16 vehicles, `10 camera recordings, 8 bulldozers and trucks, 4 cases of stealing agricultural, 4 cases of stealing about NIS 290 thousand, two cases of confiscating blacksmith equipment, an agricultural tractor, confiscating a mobile phone and an electric vehicle. Meanwhile, the colonizers stole 150 goats, a donkey, two tents, a latrine, solar energy cells, and NIS 3000.

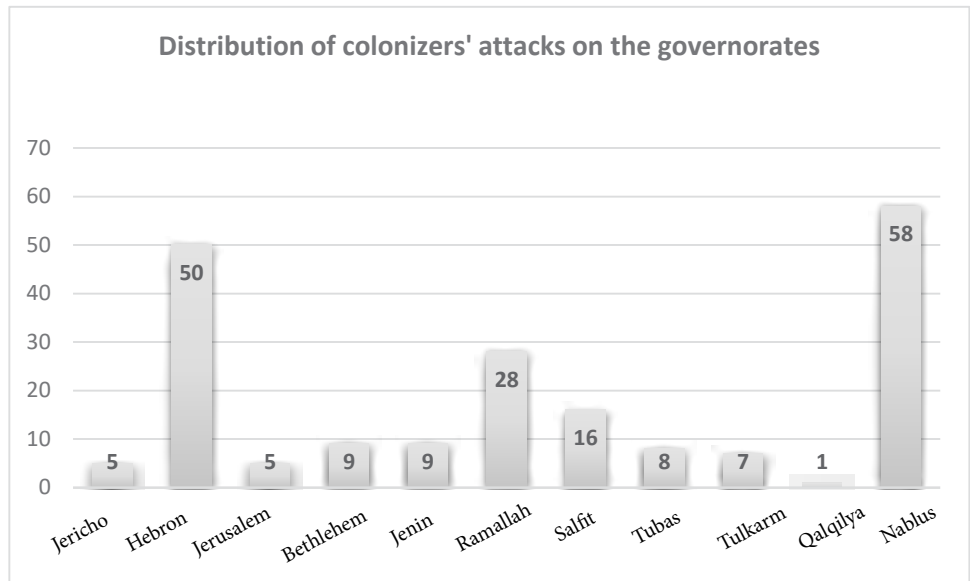

Colonizers' Attacks:

According to what was monitored and documented by the Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) during the reporting period, July 2024, the colonizers carried out 196 organized attacks. These attacks varied between the occupation army's protection of the colonists in their storming of Palestinian cities and communities, breaking into Palestinian villages, confiscating citizens' property, drawing racist slogans on the walls, and bulldozing lands, as what happened in the villages of ,Qaryut, Qusra, Husan, Jalud, Nahhalin and other villages. Furthermore, 55 vehicles were badly attacked, either by damaging or vandalism. Including the affected vehicles there were 46 broken and damaged vehicles, 2 were burned and 7 vehicles were exposed to gunfire in addition to throwing stones at the passing vehicles as well as the racist graffiti that were drawn on these vehicles.

The most prominent of these colonial attacks was storming the holy places; among which is the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque in the occupied city of Jerusalem. During

the reporting period, July 2024, 3739 Israeli colonizers, protected by the occupation army, carried out 23 raids into Al-Aqsa Mosque Squares.



Besides, 3837 colonizers carried out provocative tours under what is called “tourism to the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque. “However, most of these attacks were concentrated in Nablus Governorate, as the colonists carried out 58 attacks, followed by Hebron Governorate which witnessed 50 attacks. Meanwhile, 28 attacks were recorded in Ramallah governorate.

Examples on the Colonizers’ Attacks perpetrated in July 2024:

- **On July 4, 2024:** colonizers stormed the Bedouin community of “Ras Ein Al-Auja” north of Jericho, accompanied by 150 sheep and 30 goats to graze on the citizens’ lands there. In addition, colonizers’ excavation machines began opening a road in an area adjacent to Ras Ein Bedouin community, as part of colonial plans to confiscate the land, displace citizens, and empty it of the Palestinian presence.
- **On July 4, 2024:** About 40 colonizers, under the protection of the Israeli occupation forces, attacked the homes and properties of citizens in Al-Fandakumiya and Silat Al-Dahr, and burned vast areas of land planted with olive and fruit trees, as well as a home and a vehicle belonging to citizen

Mu'ayyad Hussein Qararia. The colonizers also attacked the houses adjacent to Qarariyeh's house, among which was the house of citizen Nader Tayseer Qararia, and fired live bullets and threw stones at them. Meanwhile, the Israeli



occupation forces fired tear gas bombs at the citizens who wanted to defend their homes. The colonizers also attacked the houses of citizens in the town of Silat al-Dahr, adjacent to the so-called "Homesh" colony, and fired live bullets, among which was a house belonging to the citizen Firas Othman Musa and Mukhtar Abu Asba. In addition, the young man Muhammad Basil Shahada was injured in the limbs during the colonizers' attack. Civil defense crews and citizens extinguished the fires that the colonizers set on the citizens' lands and in the vehicle and house of citizen Qararia.

- **On July 6, 2024:** group of colonizers stormed (al Tahaddi 10) (Challenge 10) School in Khirbet Ibziq, northeast of Tubas. They vandalized the protective fence, and removed the Palestinian flag. What is worth noting is that this Elementary



School is one of the challenge schools, and includes grades from first to sixth. Furthermore, 40 male and female students from Khirbet Ibziq and the surrounding areas study there.

- **On July 6, 2024:** colonizers set fire to dozens of dunams planted with olive trees in the village of Turmusa'ya, northeast of Ramallah, on the road between this village and Al-Mughayyir village. It is noteworthy that the colonizers have been preventing citizens by force of arms from accessing their lands for months, the thing which caused a huge spread of weeds in the fields planted with olive trees, which in turn facilitated the spread of fire there.

- **On July 14, 2024:** colonizers placed three mobile homes on the citizens' lands in Al-Rakeez area in Masafer Yatta, south of Hebron, in order to expand the so-called "Avigail" colony, which was established on the citizens' lands there.



- **On July 15, 2024:** colonizers burned vast areas of citizens' lands and attacked Bedouin homes in Wadi Yasuf, north of the village of Al-Lubban Al-Sharqiya, south of Nablus. It was reported that more than 20 colonizers from the so-called "Rehalim" colony, which was established on the lands of villages south of Nablus, attacked the Bedouin homes and tried to steal sheep from the shepherds, and threw stones at them, before the residents were able to repel the attack. The colonizers also set fire to six sites in the northwestern area of the village, which caused the burning of dozens of olive trees and vast areas of agricultural crops.

- **On July 16, 2024:** colonizers, under the protection of the Israeli occupation forces, seized a house belonging to the Jerusalemite citizen Jawad Abu Nab in Batn al-Hawa neighborhood in the town of Silwan, south of the blessed Al-Aqsa Mosque. The armed colonizers stormed the house and seized it, after removing the protection of the windows and doors, and preventing its residents from returning to it.
- On July 28, 2024: colonizers stormed the residential community of “Khallet Khader” in the northern Jordan Valley. They dismantled and stole a residential tent belonging to the citizen Zaid Shahada Fuqaha.



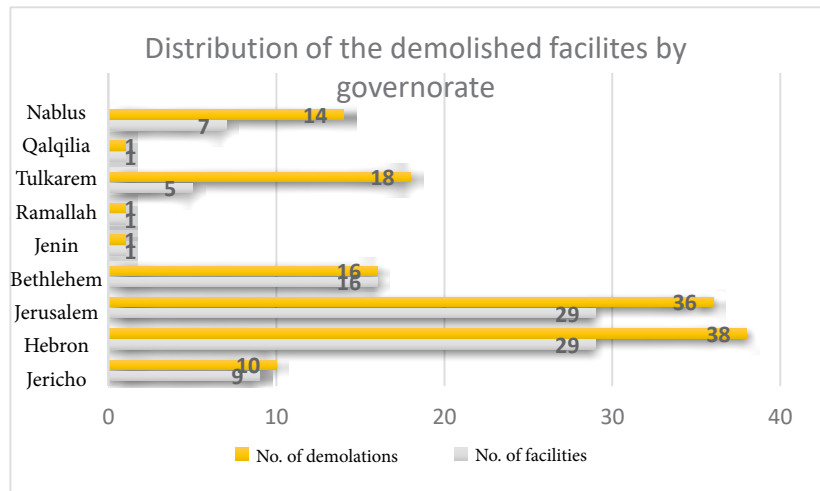
Second: Procedures and Practices of the Occupation Authorities against Palestinian Institutions

- **Demolitions**

According to the Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC), during reporting period July 2024, the occupation authorities carried out 98 demolitions that targeted 135 facilities in the West Bank and Jerusalem. Most of these demolitions were concentrated in the Governorates of Jerusalem and Hebron where 29 demolitions were recorded in each of them. These demolitions affected 38 facilities in Hebron and 36 facilities in Jerusalem. Meanwhile, Bethlehem governorate witnessed 16 demolitions that left 16 demolished facilities.

The side graph shows that the demolitions were concentrated in the central and southern areas of the West Bank.

Because the relationship between demolitions and demolition notifications is



inherent (see the notifications section), we notice the concentration in both of these operations (demolitions& demolition notifications) in the middle and southern parts of the West Bank. These notifications are concentrated in vast areas where the Israeli occupation seeks to evacuate in favor of the settler-colonial project. During the reporting period, these demolitions included: inhabited facilities, uninhabited facilities, facilities under construction, agricultural facilities, mobile homes (caravans), industrial and commercial barracks, and water wells.

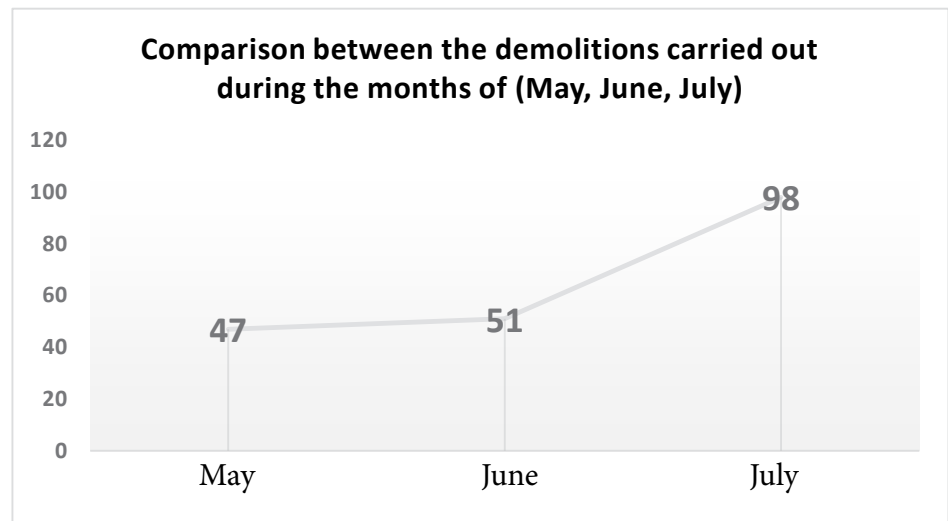

Comparison between the demolitions carried out by the Israeli occupation authorities in the West Bank governorates during the past three months.

According to the chart, we notice an enormous increase in demolitions carried out in the area classified “C”. These demolitions are



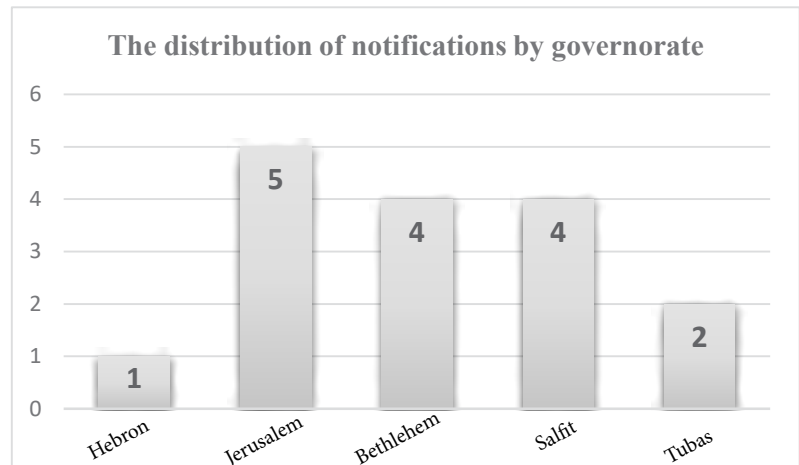
considered as a tool to implement the occupation’s plans to besiege the Palestinians and to deprive them from their right to development and urban expansion. What is worth noting is that the extremist colonial minister Bezalel Smotrich is the one who supports and gives instructions to perpetrate these demolitions. He is also threatening the so-called “B” areas with such demolitions, the thing which means that the coming years will bring more restrictions and demolitions in various parts of the West Bank.

- **Notifications (demolition, Construction Moratorium, Evacuation)**

During the reporting period, July 2024, the Israeli occupation authorities issued 16 notifications that varied between demolition notifications, construction moratoriums under the pretext of lacking permits, and evacuations under the pretext of conducting

military training. Most of these notifications were concentrated in Jerusalem Governorate which witnessed 5 notifications, followed by the Governorates of Salfit and Bethlehem where 4 notifications were monitored in each of them.

The notifications issued by the Israeli occupation authorities in the West Bank serve as a means of besieging Palestinians in Area “C” and obstructing their development and urban expansion since the



occupation controls planning in those regions and hinders the Palestinians' right to prepare and approve master plans. Such measures aim to exploit Area “C”, representing 61% of the West Bank's total area, for future colonial expansion and strategic purposes.

Third: Expropriation (Land Confiscation) in July 2024:

In July, the Israeli occupation authorities confiscated a total of 5,303 dunums of Palestinian lands in the West Bank governorates by issuing 11 military orders. These orders included one order to amend the borders of a natural reserve, eight seizure orders, and two state land declaration orders. Perhaps what signifies these military orders (seizure orders to be exact), is that they aim to create a group of buffer zones around colonies, including a buffer zone in Burqa around the colony of Homesh, another buffer zone in As-Sawiyah and Yitma around the colony of Rehalim, a buffer zone in Awarta and Rujib around the colony of Itamar, and a buffer zone in Iskaka around the colony of Neve Nehemiah.

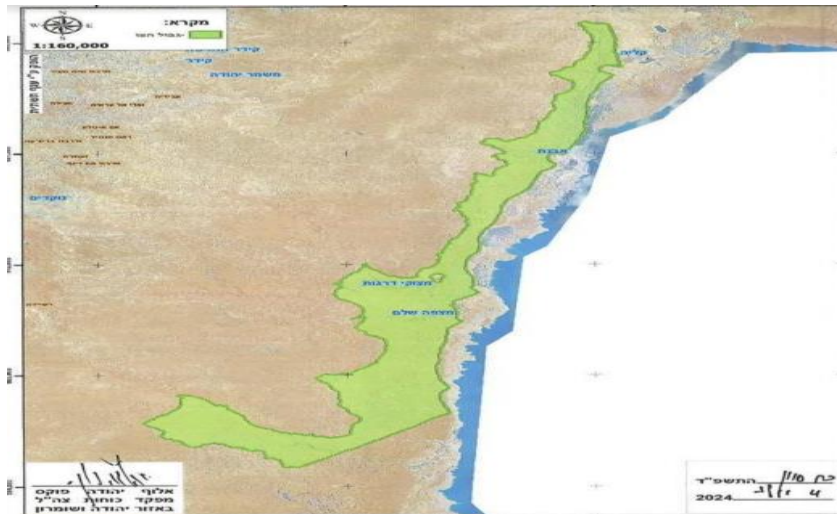

First: Orders Regarding Natural Reserves

On July 4, 2024, the commander of the Central Command in the Israeli occupation army issued an order to amend the boundaries of the Wadi Darja Nature Reserve near the Dead Sea. This modification resulted in the confiscation of 4,728 dunums, adding to a series of amendments made to the same reserve, the most recent of which was at the end of 2022, through which the occupation state confiscated 43,699 dunums. As a result, this reserve's total area under the control of the occupation state now amounts to 84,649 dunums.

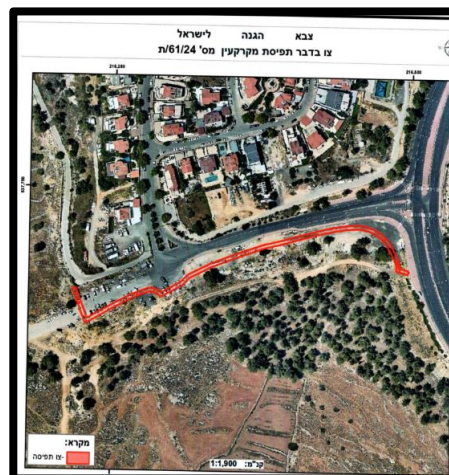
Military order map: The amendment of Wadi Darja Natural Reserve



Second: Land Seizure Orders

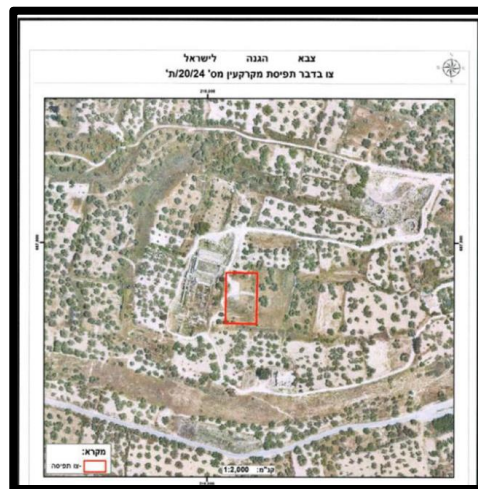
1. The Israeli occupation authorities issued a seizure order bearing No.(T/61/24) for a piece of land covering 1.012 dunums in the Jerusalem Governorate, specifically in the villages of Nabi Samwil and Beit Ikksa, intending to expand a colonial road.

Military Order Map: Nabi Samwil and Beit Ikksa



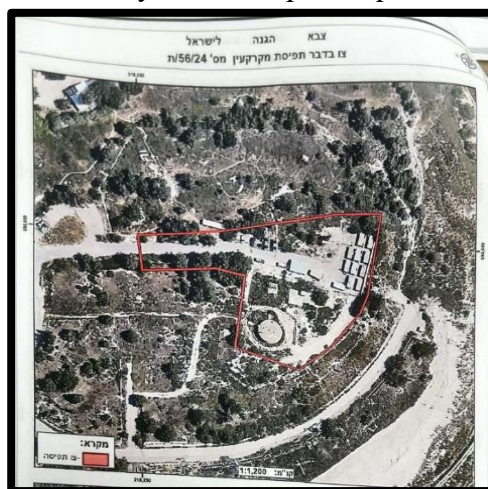
2. The Israeli occupation authorities issued a seizure order numbered (T/20/24) for a piece of land covering 1.301 dunums in the Nablus Governorate, specifically in the village of Sebastia, intending to construct a military tower to secure the colonizers' access to the archaeological site and monitor the colonial road leading to the Homesh colony.

Military Order Map: Sebastia



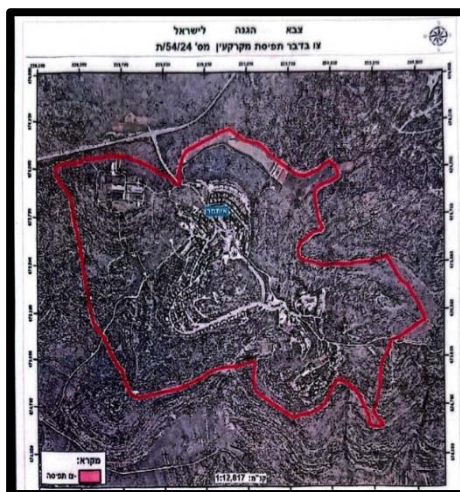
3. The Israeli occupation authorities issued a seizure order numbered (T/45/24) for a piece of land covering 14.682 dunums in the Nablus Governorate, specifically in the lands of the village of Burqa, to create a buffer zone around the colony buildings in the Homesh colony, which has been resettled.

Military Order Map: Burqa



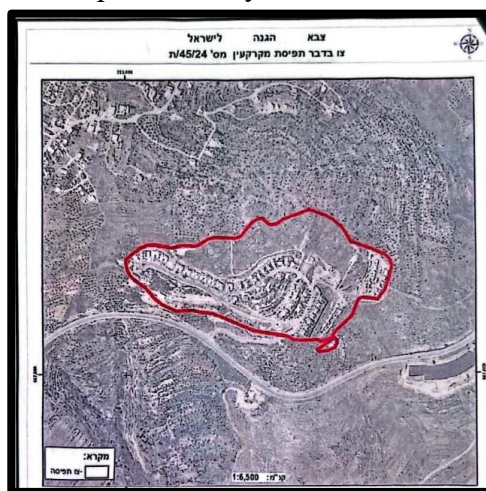
4. The Israeli occupation authorities issued a seizure order numbered (T/54/24) for a piece of land covering 30.156 dunums in the Nablus Governorate, specifically in the lands of the villages of Awarta and Rujib, for the purpose of creating a buffer zone around the colonial buildings in the Itamar colony.

Map of Military Order: Awarta and Rujib



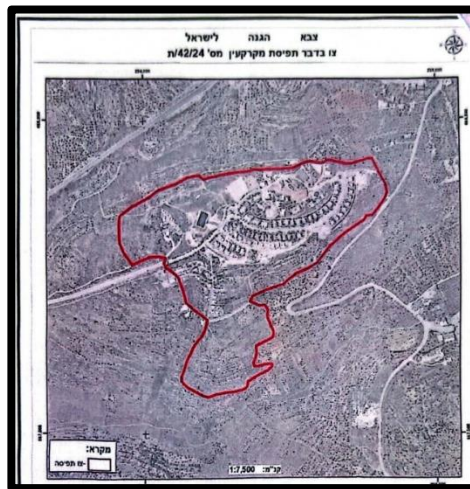
5. The Israeli occupation authorities issued a seizure order numbered (T/54/24) for a piece of land covering 7.902 dunums in the Salfit Governorate, specifically in the lands of the village of Iskaka, for the purpose of creating a buffer zone around the colonial buildings in the so-called “Neve Nehemiah” colony.

Map of Military Order: Iskaka



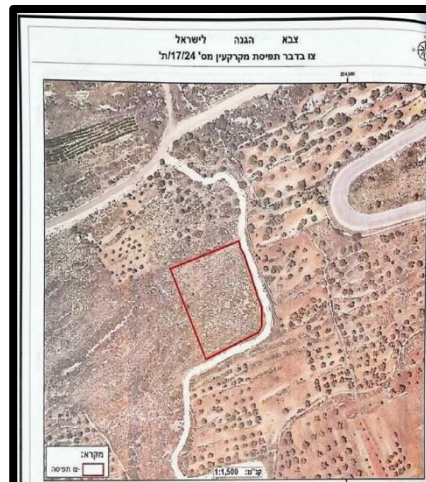
6. The Israeli occupation authorities issued a seizure order numbered (T/42/24) for a piece of land covering 9.39 dunums in the Nablus Governorate, specifically in the lands of the villages of As-Sawiya and Yatma, for the purpose of creating a buffer zone around the colonial buildings in the Rehalim colonial.

Map of Military Order: Al-Sawiya and Yatma



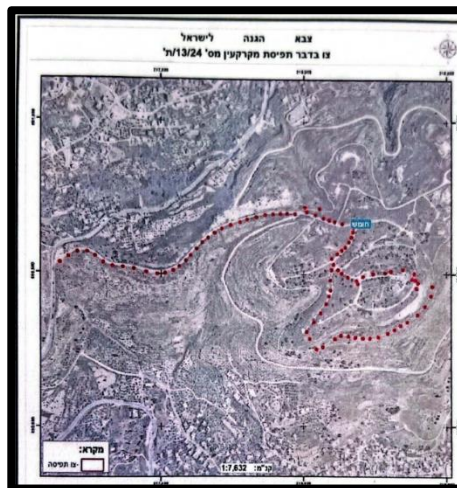
7. The Israeli occupation authorities issued a seizure order numbered (T/17/24) for a piece of land covering 3.241 dunams in the Nablus Governorate, specifically in the lands of the village of As-Sawiya, for the purpose of constructing a military tower.

Third: State Land Declarations

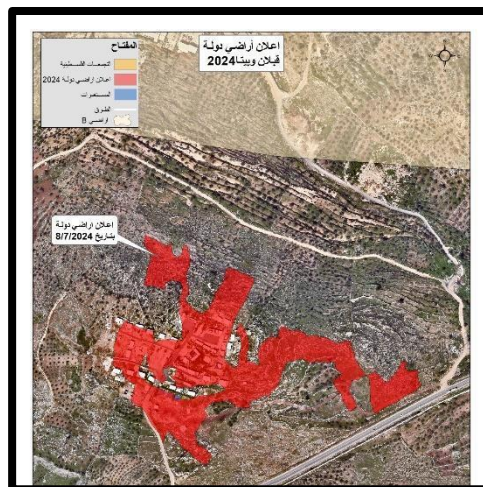
On July 8, 2024, the Israeli occupation state announced its seizure of 65 dunums of land from the citizens in the villages of Qabalan and Beita. The seizure, under the pretext of state land, aims to regularize the situation of the colonial outpost Avitar established on citizens' land in Mount Sabih. Last June, the occupation cabinet announced its intention to "legalize" the status of 5 new colonial outposts.

1. On July 16, 2024, the Israeli occupation state announced its seizure of 441 dunums of land from the citizens in the villages of Shibtin, Deir Ammar, and Deir Qaddis in the western Ramallah Governorate. The seizure, under the pretext of state land, aims to tighten control over the total area surrounding the Nili and Na'ali colonies established on citizens' land. The targeted area consists of a series of plots surrounding the mentioned colonies and continues the land confiscation carried out by the occupation state in previous years, specifically in 2021.

Fourth: Laws and Bills proposed or approved by the Israeli Knesset in July 2024:

In this part of the report, we review the most prominent of the laws and bills that were studied in the Occupation's Knesset. Considering the nature of these laws, their hostile and racist nature can be inferred, through which the legislative bodies in the occupation state seek to entrench a system of suppression against Palestinians or to perpetuate the racial segregation and apartheid imposed on them. More recently, the occupation started exploiting the conditions of war and emergency laws to create a new reality that cannot be reversed, according to the Israeli description.

An example of this is the proposed legal project that seeks to expand the powers of the so-called "Israeli Antiquities Authority" to encompass all Palestinian territories, serving as a gateway for controlling archaeological sites and eventually annexing large areas of Palestinian land. This is in addition to the performative political decision aimed at preventing the establishment of a Palestinian state, as a defiant message to the world regarding the prospects for a political solution.

The bill does not specify any particular areas in the West Bank; rather, it represents one of the creeping annexation laws.

Fifth: Colonial Expansion Plans/ legalizing outposts:

In July, the Israeli occupation authorities reviewed 54 master plans for colonies in the West Bank and Jerusalem, approving 20 of them—1 in Jerusalem and 19 in the West Bank colonies. They also submitted 33 plans for subsequent approval, including 1 in Jerusalem and 32 in various West Bank governorates. Mr Sha’ban pointed out that, aside from the significant geopolitical impact of these plans, they also led to the "legalization" of 3 new colonial outposts in the Jordan Valley, Jericho, and Hebron, aiming to turn them into recognized settlements with full colonial benefits. This process adds to 11 other outposts whose regularization began earlier this year.

Second: Jerusalem Master Plans

Sixth: The Most Prominent Racist Statements/discourse by members of the Israeli government:

These days, leaders of the Israeli occupation started making their racist statements unabashedly, revealing their superiority complexes and racist stances. In this section of the report, we quickly review the most prominent statements.

- July 2, 2024: Channel 14: MK Almog Cohen in the Supreme Court hearing regarding allowing injured individuals from Gaza to receive treatment in the Israeli occupation state: "I want to harm them and be cruel with them, and I will use my immunity to prevent that (receiving treatment in Israel)"
- July 13, 2024: National Unity MK, Gideon Sa'ar posted on the "X" platform celebrating the massacre in the Al-Mawasi area: "Congratulations to the Prime Minister and the Minister of Defense for the decision. Congratulations to the Israeli army and Shin Bet for the execution. The attack must continue." On the same day, Religious Zionism MK, Zvi Sukkot posted about the Al-Mawasi massacre on his "X" page: "Slowly, they will understand that there are only two options left: surrender or genocide... Only when this idea penetrates will

we succeed in bringing the captives back home... Today was an important step on the path."

- July 21, 2024: Likud MK, Ari'el Kilner, posted against the prisoners on the "X" platform, stating, "There is no need to release terrorists even if there is overcrowding; this should be according to fixed instructions, not just based on current circumstances."
- July 22, 2024: Likud MK Boaz Bismuth posted against UNRWA on the "X" platform, "I am pleased to announce that the law I initiated to shut down UNRWA has now passed its first reading! With a little more effort, we will be able to eliminate this terrorist organization."
- July 24, 2024: So-called "National Security Minister" Itamar Ben-Gvir posted on the "X" platform: "I am the political echelon and the political echelon permits the storming of Al-Aqsa Mosque and praying there." On July 26, 2024, he added on the same platform: "The entire Gaza Strip should be occupied, and Palestinians should be encouraged to emigrate from it."
- July 27, 2024: Chairman of the so-called "National Security Committee", MK Tzvika Fogel, stated: "I want to see Lebanon closed and Hezbollah burning—Mr. Prime Minister, enough with containment—the rule of the Galilee and the Golan should be like the rule of Tel Aviv—Let's go on the attack."
- July 29, 2024: The Israeli newspaper "Israel Hayom" quoted Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich as saying he supports the demonstrators against the arrest of criminals in Sde Timan prison: "The civil protest against the terrible injustice

faced by the reservists in Sde Timan is justified, and I fully support it. He added: "The army soldiers deserve respect. Army soldiers should not be arrested like criminals. I call on the military prosecutor to lift their hands off our heroic fighters!"
