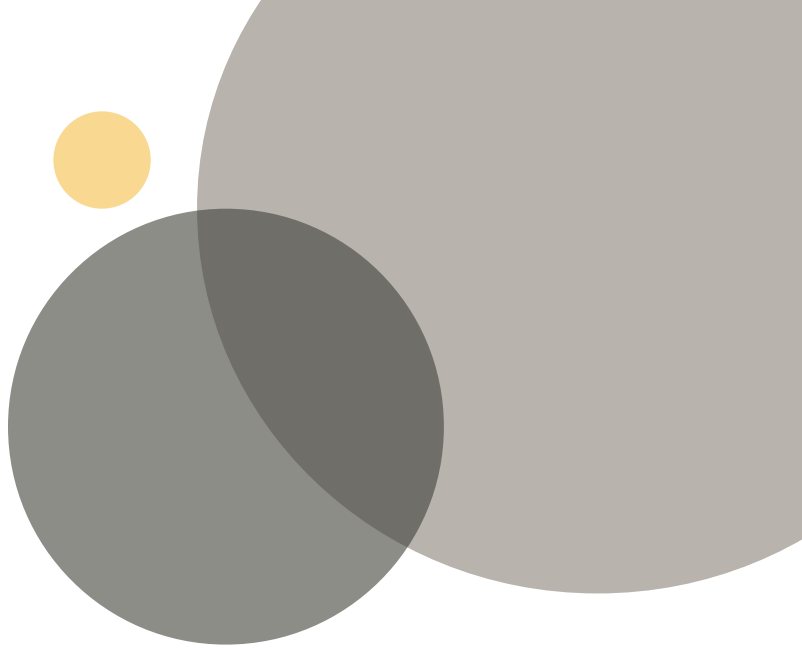

Foreword

Since the Israeli government has waged its war against our people in Gaza Strip, the West Bank and Jerusalem two months ago, the occupying state has practiced and committed all heinous crimes that humanity has ever known, in blatant violation of all ethics and rules of wars, crises and conflicts. The Israeli attacks, which are perpetrated either by the occupation forces or by its colonizers, have reached record levels in terms of their number, and nature which targets the Palestinian presence everywhere on the Palestinian land. That is, as compared with the past months, the Palestinian citizen has become targeted either by official occupation measures, or by organized state terrorism represented in the crimes of the colonial gangs.

Thus, as the occupying state tries to make propaganda material from the Palestinian blood for the success of its government, the Palestinian citizen continues to pay a heavy price for his security, his life, and his property. It allows its soldiers and the militias of its colonizers to commit bloody crimes against those steadfast on their land in an unequal battle trying to preserve and protect their land, property, and existence.

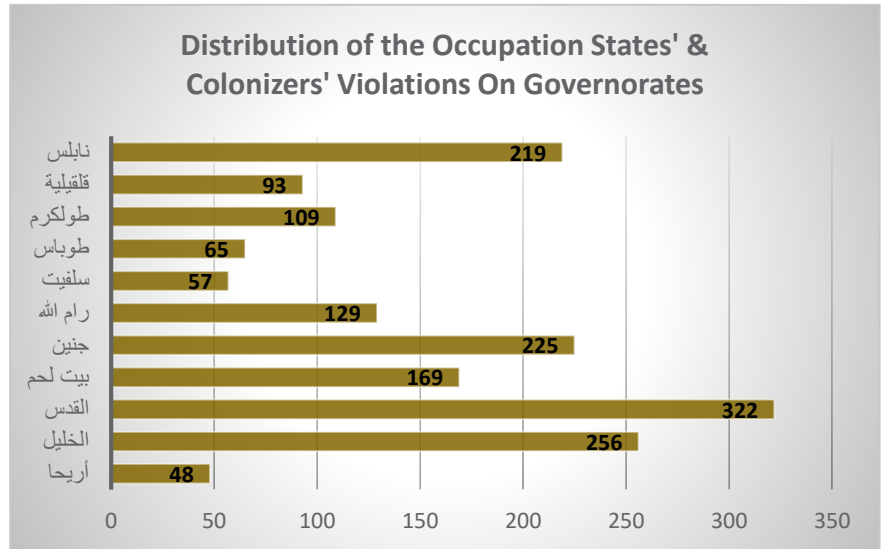

First: Violations of the Israeli Occupation State & Colonizers in the Occupied Palestinian Territories during November 2023

During the reporting period, November 2023, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) monitored 1692 attacks. These attacks were carried out by the various bodies of the occupying state, including its colonial militia, against Palestinian citizens and their property.

These attacks included martyrdom, physical injuries, whether by live bullets or gas, as well as incursions, sabotage, theft, and confiscation of property, bulldozing lands, and uprooting trees.

However, these attacks were concentrated in the governorate



of Jerusalem which witnessed 322 attacks, followed by Hebron Governorate (256 attacks), then Jenin Governorate (225 attacks), and finally Nablus Governorate which witnessed 219 attacks, in addition to hundreds of attacks perpetrated in the governorates of Tulkarm, Ramallah and Bethlehem.

During the reporting period mentioned above, these attacks resulted in the martyrdom of 116 Palestinians in the West Bank and Jerusalem. The governorates of the West Bank and Jerusalem witnessed intense attacks, about (60%) of the total of these attacks. These attacks included 339 attacks on property and holy places, 68 attacks on lands and natural resources, 1285 attacks on citizens and many other classifications.

a-The occupying state’s and colonizers’ attacks on Palestinian citizens, their property, and holy places:

Attacks on citizens:

During the reporting period, November 2023, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 1285 attacks on citizens. Most of these attacks were concentrated in Jerusalem Governorate which witnessed 299 attacks, followed by Hebron Governorate which witnessed 169 attacks. Meanwhile, there were 157 attacks in Jenin Governorate and 149 attacks in Nablus. These attacks varied between shooting, arrest campaigns, shutting down checkpoints and imposing traffic restrictions on citizens. These attacks caused the martyrdom of 116 Palestinians.

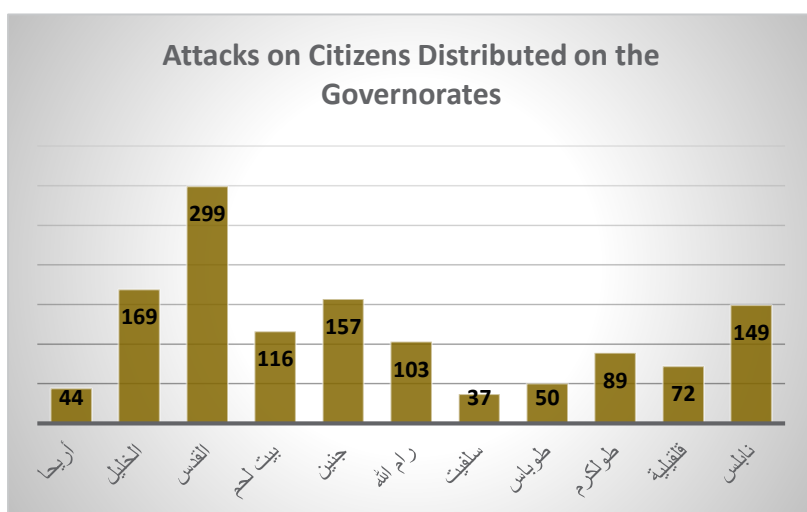
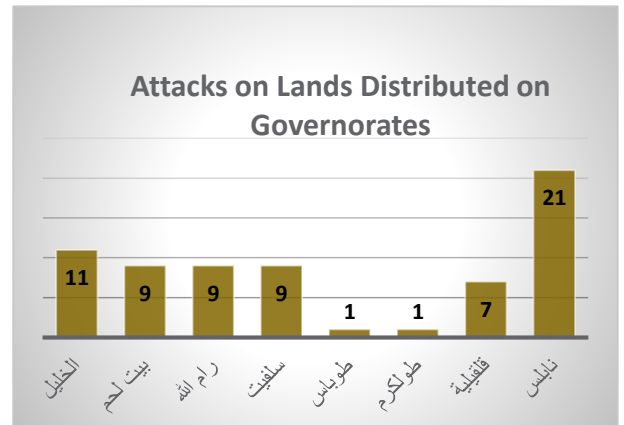

Attacks on Lands & Natural Resources:

During November, 2023, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) has documented 68 attacks on Palestinian lands and natural resources. These attacks were concentrated in Nablus Governorate which witnessed 21 attacks, followed by Hebron Governorate (11 attacks). Meanwhile, 9 attacks were recorded in each of Bethlehem, Ramallah and Salfit governorate. These attacks affected hundreds of dunums of citizens’ lands. The reporting period, November 2023, witnessed 4 colonial attempts to establish outposts on citizens’ lands. In addition, the Israeli occupation forces as well as its colonizers carried out 23 bulldozing lands’ operations. Most of these operations were recorded in Nablus Governorate which witnessed 7 operations, followed by Bethlehem, Hebron and Ramallah governorates¹.



Assaults on Trees:

During the reporting period, November, 2023, the Colonization & Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) documented 35 attacks that targeted olive trees and caused the uprooting and burning of 3232 trees among which there were 3082 olive trees.

Most of these assaults were concentrated in Nablus governorate where 11 attacks were recorded and caused the uprooting and burning of 1400 trees. Next, there were 7 attacks in Hebron governorate that caused the uprooting and burning of 100 trees;

and 6 attacks in Salfit Governorate that affected 332 trees. Meanwhile, there were 4 attacks in Qalqilia that caused the uprooting and damaging 300 trees.

Attacks on Palestinians’ Properties:

During the reporting period, November 2023, the Israeli occupation forces along with the colonial militias carried out several campaigns to confiscate, steal, and sabotage citizens’ property. These properties included agricultural tractors, bulldozers, cameras’ recordings, vehicles, electrical supplies, money, olive harvesting equipment, olive fruits, cows and caravans.

During November 2023, the Israeli occupation carried out 339 attacks on properties², causing the vandalism and confiscation of approximately 259 Palestinian properties, including the confiscation of 38 vehicles, 9 camera recordings, 6 bulldozers and tractors, 7 electrical equipment, mobile phones and computers, 5 cases of money and gold theft (about NIS 40000), confiscation of barracks for raising livestock, 4 cases of confiscation equipment for olive picking, 2 cases of confiscating olive fruits from citizens. As for colonizer’s attacks on properties; they were as follows: 70

cows were stolen by colonizers as well as there were 9 cases of confiscating olive picking equipment, 6 cases of theft olive fruits, 3 barracks for raising livestock, 3 caravans, agricultural tractor.

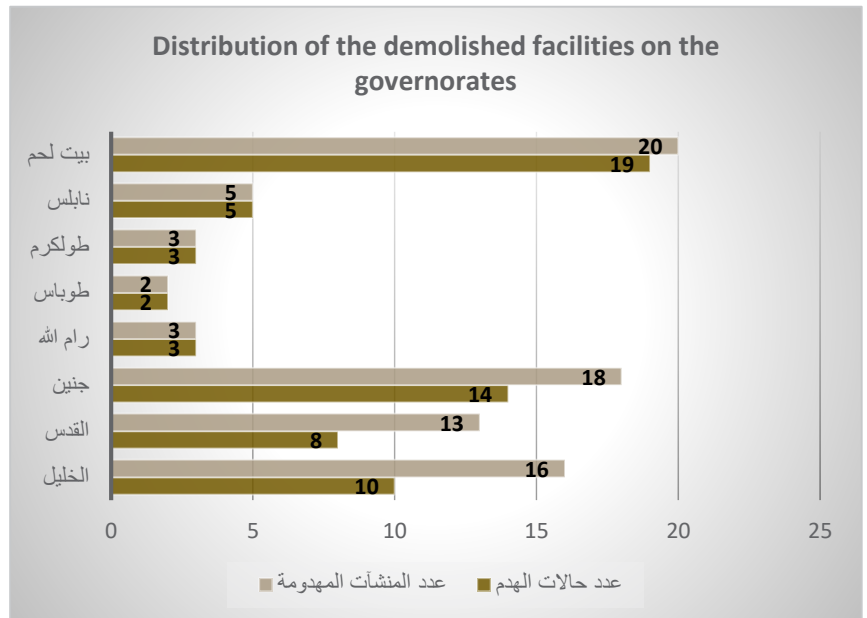

Israeli Occupation’s Procedures & Measures against Palestinian Facilities:

a-Demolitions:

During November 2023, the Israeli Occupation Authorities carried out 64 demolition operations, affecting 80 facilities in the West Bank, including the city of Jerusalem. Most of the demolition operations were concentrated in Bethlehem

governorate, which witnessed 19 demolition operations, causing the demolition of 20 facilities. Meanwhile, 14



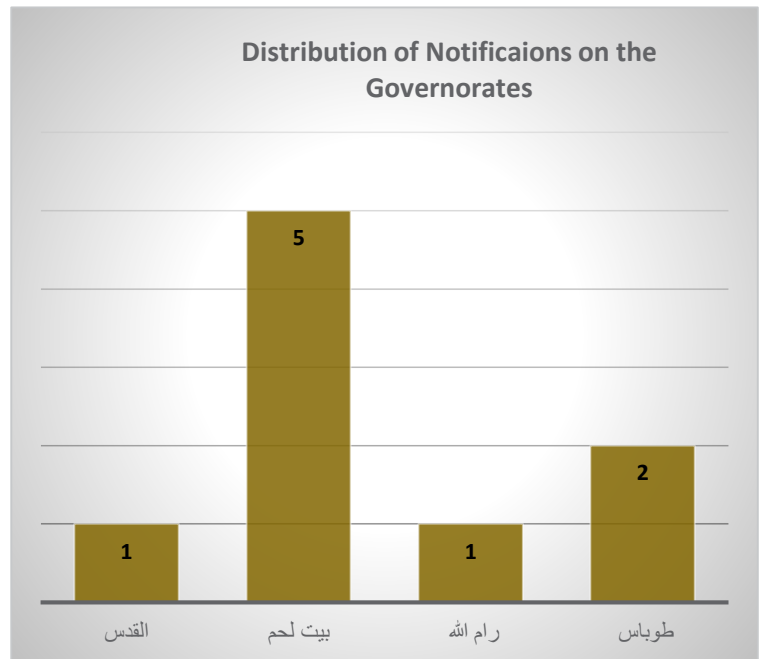
demolition operations were documented in Jenin Governorate, causing the demolition of 18 facilities. In Hebron Governorate, 10 demolition operations were perpetrated, causing the demolition of 16 facilities. The following chart shows that demolition operations were concentrated in the southern and northern parts of the West Bank. The demolitions carried out during the reporting period, November 2023, included the following facilities: inhabited facilities, uninhabited facilities, under construction facilities, agricultural facilities, caravans, commercial and industrial barracks.

Notifications (Demolitions & Construction Moratoriums)

During the reporting period, November 2023, The Israeli occupation forces issued 9 notifications of demolition and construction moratorium for Palestinian facilities under the pretext of lacking a license or an eviction to conduct military training. Most of these notifications were issued in Bethlehem Governorate which received 5 notifications, followed by Tubas Governorate which received 2 notifications.



Meanwhile, Jerusalem and Ramallah governorates received one notification for each.

These notifications which were issued by the Israeli occupation authorities in the West Bank are considered one of the colonial tools of besieging the Palestinians in the area classified “C” and preventing them from urban development and expansion there, since the Israeli occupation imposes its control over planning in those areas and deprives the Palestinians from their right to prepare master plans and rejects them if they are submitted. Such measures aim to exploit area “C”, which represents 61% of the West Bank’s total area. However, the Israeli Occupation seeks to keep this area as a strategic reserve for the colonial expansion in the future.

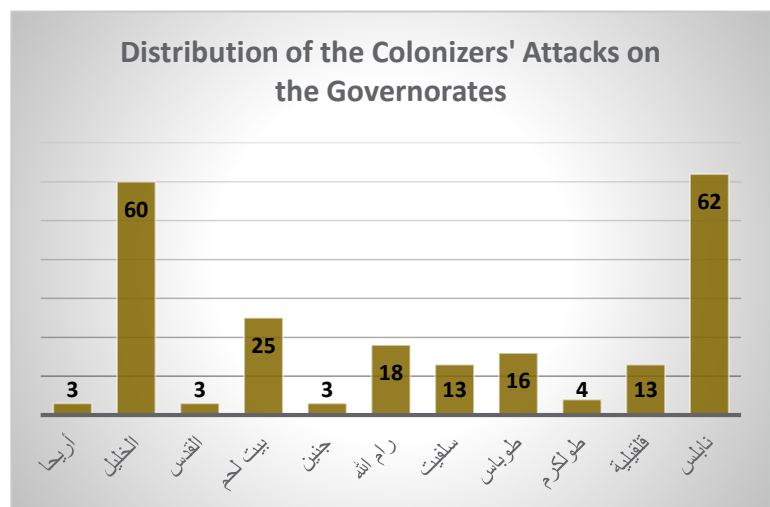

Colonizers’ Attacks:

According to what was monitored and documented by the Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission (CWRC) during the reporting period, the colonizers carried out 220 organized attacks. These attacks varied between the occupation army’s protection of the colonists in their storming of Palestinian cities and communities, breaking into Palestinian villages, confiscating citizens’ property, drawing racist slogans on the walls, and bulldozing lands, as what happened in the villages of Yanoon, Hares, Deir Istia, Ras Karkar, Yatta, Masafer Yatta, Bireen, Al Khader and al Mughayyir.

Furthermore, 63 vehicles were badly attacked, either by damaging or vandalism. Including the affected vehicles there were 39 broken and damaged vehicles, 6 were burned and 18 vehicles were exposed to gunfire in addition to throwing stones at the passing vehicles as well as the racist graffiti that were drawn on these vehicles.

The most prominent of these colonial attacks was storming the holy places; among which is the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque in the occupied city of Jerusalem. During the reporting period, November 2023, 3010 Israeli colonizers, protected by the occupation army, carried out 22 raids into Al-Aqsa Mosque Squares. Besides, 678



colonizers carried out provocative tours under what is called “tourism to the squares of Al-Aqsa Mosque.” In addition, a complete closure has been imposed on “al Ibrahimi Mosque”, since the Israeli government has launched its war on Gaza Strip, on the 7th of October. However, most of these attacks were concentrated in Nablus Governorate, as the colonists carried out 62 attacks, followed by Hebron Governorate which witnessed 60 attacks.

The Most Prominent Examples of Colonizers Attacks

On November 21, 2023: A group of colonisers set fire to the Zanuta Primary Mixed School north of Hebron, causing three classrooms to burn down. The school has experienced two other accounts of attempted arson in the past month, in addition to an attack carried out by colonizers on a female employee where they physically assaulted her.



On November 17, 2023: colonizers seized control of Silwan Spring in the Qaryut Village in the Nablus Governorate, transforming it into a pool and a park for their exclusive use after taking control and closing all roads leading to it, prohibiting Palestinian citizens from using. They also prohibit them from harvesting their olives by destroying the olive trees in the area. (The image depicts settlers attacking trees in Qaryut).



On November 12, 2023: colonizers from the colony of Shilo, established on citizens' lands in the villages of Turmusayya and Sinjil in the Ramallah Governorate, assaulted the citizen Wael Ghafri, from Sinjil, while he was harvesting olives in Al-Ma'shariyah in Sinjil. A group of 4 colonizers arrived at the scene in a silver Toyota Station, demanding that the citizens evacuate the area and stop harvesting the olives, then assaulted some of them.



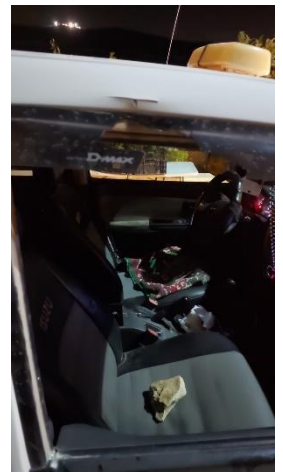
On November 8, 2023: On Wednesday evening, the two brothers, Mohammad and Hamzah Abd Ar-Rahman, sustained injuries and wounds as a result of a colonizer attack while they were on their land in the town Bruqin, west of Salfit. The Brother of the injured, Bashar Rafiq Abd Ar-Rahman, testified, "A group of colonizers attacked my brothers Hamza and Muhammad with stones, sticks, and bats while they were harvesting olives on our land located in the northern area near the colony of Bruchin, established on the lands of Palestinian citizens. This resulted in Mohammed sustaining bruises, and Hamza suffering head injuries. They were transported to the Martyr Yasser Arafat Hospital in Salfit."



On November 10, 2023: A group of colonizers destroyed the water supply of At-Tawani village. This water line feeds several communities in Masafer Yatta, south of Hebron. The Israeli occupation forces searched the homes of the citizens of Masafer Yatta and tampered with their contents. Meanwhile, colonizers worked on cutting the water supply line to more than 16 residential clusters. They also placed spikes on the roads leading to the village of At-Tawani with the aim of damaging the tires of citizens' vehicles.



On November 12, 2023: On Sunday evening, a group of colonizers attacked citizens' cars on the Ramallah-Nablus road, which led to material damage to several of them. A group of colonizers threw stones at the vehicles of citizens on the main road near the town of Turmusa'ya, northeast of Ramallah, causing material damage to a number of them. As a result, the vehicle of citizen Husni Assaf, from the Jamma'in Village, had its windows smashed. This incident occurred on the main road near the "Shilo" colony, situated on privately owned citizens' lands north of Ramallah.



Second: Israeli Occupation Land Control Measures

Military Orders

In November, the Israeli occupation authorities started issuing many military orders, referred to as “urgent orders” to seize vast areas of private lands. These orders prohibit people from objecting to them in an attempt to dissuade Palestinian efforts to reclaim these lands. In the past month, the occupation authorities confiscated a total of 23.777 dunums by issuing 6 land seizure orders for military and security purposes in the governorates of Nablus, Bethlehem, and Ramallah.

Colonial Plans for November 2023

The Israeli occupation authorities intensified the examination of colonial master plans in November, whether these plans were for approval or deposit to expand colonies at the expense of privately-owned citizen lands. These authorities submitted 19 master plans for study, aiming at the expansion of colonies with a total of 2364 colonial units. These plans were concentrated in the governorates of Qalqilia, Bethlehem, Salfit, Jericho, and Hebron. Additionally, approval was granted for establishing two power facilities in the Jericho Governorate."

Third: Racist Statements/ Discourse by Members of the Israeli Government

These days, leaders of the Israeli occupation started making their racist statements unabashedly, revealing their superiority complexes and racist stances. These statements show their complete disregard for the most fundamental human rights in one of the manifestations of the terrorism of the occupying state.

In this section of the report, we quickly review the most prominent statements.

On November 1, 2023, Zvi Sukkot, the Executive Director of the far-right Otzma Yehudit party and a Member of the Knesset, posted on his Facebook page saying, “After watching the film presented by the army spokesperson, I came out a

new person entirely. We will seek revenge and dedicate all our time to achieve it without a second thought”.

On November 5, 2023, Amihai Eliyahu, the Israeli occupation government’s Minister of Heritage said that detonating a nuclear bomb on Gaza is a possible solution, adding that the Gaza Strip should not remain on the face of the Earth, and Israel should re-establish colonies there. He also believed that war has its costs for what he described as the "abducted" Israelis by Palestinian resistance. In response to a question in an interview with "Kol Berama" radio (local radio station) about whether Gaza should be bombed with a nuclear bomb, Eliyahu answered, "That’s one-way ³."

On November 6, 2023, in a letter addressed to the occupation’s Prime Minister and Minister of War, the extremist Minister of Finance, Bezalel Smotrich said, “We cannot pretend that the friction harms military efforts and international legitimacy and is failing to maintain acceptable levels of security by creating “no-go” zones and keeping away the chaotic left-wing activists who ignited the fire in the region...For months I cried out in the cabinet and was answered with disdain and silence. We all pay the price today. I will not allow additional blood to be spilt on my watch and on my conscience” while demanding the creation of “sterile” no-go areas around the colonies in the West Bank and prohibiting the presence of Palestinians in their vicinity. Explaining: "The establishment of security zones is important for at least three purposes: First: To establish security and prevent the approach of Arabs who may use this to launch attacks. Second: To provide a sense of security due to the high sensitivity and the drafting of many men into reserve duty, leaving women and children alone. Third: to prevent friction that could lead to a flareup in the region

and cause us great international damage.⁴” **On November 14, 2023**, he tweeted on the X platform, saying: "The migration of Gaza residents to world countries is the correct and optimal humanitarian solution." **On November 30, 2023**, the extremist Finance Minister Smotrich tweeted on the "X" site, commenting on the attack carried out by two Palestinians in Jerusalem, stating, "We will not calm down, and we will not be silent until victory is achieved on all fronts. We are at war on all fronts. The horrific attack in Jerusalem reminds us that our enemies are not only in Gaza. We will pursue them and destroy them with the help of God wherever there are 2 million Nazis in the West Bank."

On November 7, 2023, in response to the reports that claim the United States rejected the distribution of weapon shipments to colonizers, Yossi Dagan, the head of the Shomron Colonial Council (North of the West Bank), stated: “There seems to be some serious confusion here. The Jewish and Samaritan residents are in real and immediate danger.” Dagan added: "There is a valid reason to fear that what happened in southern Israel will be repeated in the Jewish and Samaritan communities in Judea and Samaria adjacent to villages under the control of the Palestinian Authority," "What the government should do now is issue a clear and realistic statement without ambiguity to the media worldwide exposing the myth of "settler violence," which is a bloody defamation fabricated by an extreme leftist organization. He added: "The Israeli government should be using the significant resources at its disposal and its access to international media platforms to explain that the first response emergency teams are units affiliated with the Israeli army dedicated to protecting communities against terrorists." "We should not succumb to the defamation campaign being

waged against half a million citizens in the State of Israel. While 80% of the male residents of Judea and Samaria are on emergency military duty, and their families are alone at home, concerned about the safety of their fathers and sons, our leaders should not encourage this defamatory campaign that tarnishes the reputation of the residents of Judea and Samaria. These communities," Dagan continued. "The government must speak out openly in their defence. I urge the Prime Minister to immediately notify the Americans that weapons will be distributed to all Israeli soldiers, including those living in Judea and Samaria. In conclusion, we will not be a party to this game of 'whose blood is thicker'.⁵

On November 12, 2023, in an interview with the Israeli occupation's Channel 12, the Israeli occupation's Minister of Agriculture, Avi Decthter, was asked by the Israeli anchor, Amit Segal: "When we see millions in the Gaza Strip heading south with white flags, is this a psychological goal of the operation? Is this a strategic or temporary matter?" Decthter replied, "Initially, this is an operational matter. We must realize that we have many soldiers there, and they have to operate in densely populated areas. Working in densely populated areas is difficult, so it is necessary to reduce the population there." Decthter continued, "Today, we are repeating the Nakba of Gaza. This is the Nakba of Gaza. Operationally, it is impossible to manage a battle as the army wants to manage it in the Gaza Strip while people are between tanks and soldiers." The interviewer wanted to confirm what the minister was saying, so he asked again, "Is this the Nakba of Gaza, Avi Decthter?" The minister answered, "The Nakba of Gaza in 2023." The interviewer then asked, "Is this how it will end? Will they not return to the city of Gaza?" Decthter replied, "I don't know how it will

end. In the end, remember that the city of Gaza covers a third of the Strip and houses half of its population. There are two-thirds elsewhere, including the camps of Al-Majdal, Khan Yunis, Rafah, and six refugee camps."
